



STOCK TROLLEY

Alternative names: platform trolley, supermarket trolley

Stock trolleys are trolleys with collapsible platforms. Stock trolleys can transport non-stackable or fragile products from stock shelves to shop shelves. The top platform can be used as a makeshift workspace/worktable for unpacking products or for other manual handling when stocking and organising shelves.

Benefits

- You can transport many and several different types of products at one time and you avoid having to carry loads over longer distances
- Products can be placed on the top or bottom platform, depending on their weight and/or whether they to go onto lower or higher shelves
- The top platform can be folded up to allow for easier access to the products on the bottom platform
- There are many different types of stock trolleys on the market, so you can choose the type best suited to your products and tasks

Requirements for use

- The stock trolley should be suited for the product and task at hand, for example with regard to size and load capacity
- There should be room to move and manoeuvre the stock trolley and to position it appropriately for the task at hand
- The surface of transport routes should be even, stable, level and without holes, and the route should be well lit
- Note any recommendations in the instructions for use concerning load distribution on the trolley, for example

Considerations prior to procurement

- For what uses and products do we need a stock trolley?
- What are our requirements for the stock trolley, for example with regard to size, platform heights, handles, type of wheels, load capacity, etc.?

After procurement

- Inspect for deficiencies/defects before use
- Should be maintained as described in the instructions for use
- Employees should be instructed in how and for what tasks the stock trolley should be used
- Make sure the instructions are followed
